Responsibilities:

Planning, coordinating, and enforcing fire prevention and life safety activities for Burnet County ESD9. Regular interaction with firefighters, developers, the public, civic groups, and other outside agencies. Reviews commercial building and subdivision plans to ensure compliance with District Fire Code and Standards.

Inspects buildings, subdivision infrastructure, fire protection systems, etc. to ensure fire code compliance. Investigates complaints of fire and hazardous materials violations, issue correction notices and citations.

Job Requirements:

4 years firefighting experience.

Valid State of Texas Driver's License Class B Exempt.

Texas Department of State Health Services EMT-Basic or higher.

Texas Fire Officer Training: Fire Officer I, Intermediate (or Higher) Fire Fighter, Fire Inspector & Plans Inspector.

Knowledge: Principles, methods and practices of modern fire science and fire prevention technology; the International Fire Code; applicable local, state, and federal fire codes, ordinances, and regulations; characteristics and behaviors of fires; fire protection systems and building construction; National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) fire protection design standards.

Skills: Deals effectively and persuasively with the public; utilizes appropriate computer software to prepare necessary reports; maintains cooperative working relationships with builders, contractors, BCESD9 staff and the public.

Abilities: Reads and interprets construction plans and specifications; effectively represents BCESD9 when meeting with contractors, engineers and developers as well as in public meetings; maintains high standards of ethical conduct; applies technical knowledge, follow proper inspection techniques and detect deviations from plans, regulations and standard safety practices; displays a high level of initiative, effort and commitment towards completing assignments efficiently; works with minimal supervision; demonstrates strong attention to detail.
